Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Autumn Quarter of 2005

October 12, 2005

Autumn Quarter began on September 21, 2005. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on October 10. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall decrease in enrollment of 617 students, compared to Autumn Quarter 2004, was recorded for Autumn Quarter 2005. The Columbus campus decreased by 491 to 50,504 (-1.0%). The Lima campus decreased 136 to 1,145 (-10.6%), Mansfield decreased 24 to 1,610 (-1.5%), and Marion decreased 36 to 1,485 (-2.4%). The Newark campus increased 40 to 2,183 (1.9%) and Wooster increased 30 to 821 (3.8%).

- Decreases in the undergraduate enrollment (down 211 to 44,307; -0.5%), graduate professional enrollment (down 7 to 3,269; -0.2%) and graduate enrollment (down 399 to 10,172; -3.8%) were recorded this quarter. Three sources of total undergraduate enrollment experienced increases: New first-quarter freshmen (up 16 to 8,048; 0.2%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 3 to 1,411; 0.2%), and former students (up 47 to 1,571; 3.1%). Sources which experienced decreases were transfer students above Rank 2 (down 130 to 1,454; -8.2%), and continuing students (down 147 to 31,823; -0.5%). At the extended campuses as a whole, two source categories recorded an increase: New first-quarter freshmen (up 136 to 2,188; 6.6%), and former students (up 36 to 452; 8.7%). The remaining categories; transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (down 29 to 190; -13.2%), transfer students above Rank 2 (down 89 to 410; -17.8%), and continuing students (down 167 to 3,656; -4.4%) saw decreases. Three sources of undergraduate enrollment at the Columbus campus experienced increases from Autumn Quarter 2004: transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 32 to 1,221; 2.7%), continuing students (up 20 to 28,167; 0.1%), and former students (up 11 to 1,119; 1.0%). The remaining undergraduate source categories on the Columbus campus experienced decreases: New first-quarter freshmen students (down 120 to 5,860; -2.0%), and transfer students above Rank 2 (down 41 to 1,044; -3.8%). The enrollment of graduate students at Columbus campus for Autumn Quarter 2005 decreased from Autumn Quarter 2004 (down 386 to 9,824; -3.8%) as did the enrollment of graduate students at the extended campuses (down 13 to 348; -3.6%). Overall, all sources of graduate enrollment were down: new graduate students (down 179 to 2,248; -7.4%), continuing graduate students (down 83 to 7,510; -1.1%) and former graduate students (down 137 to 414; -24.9%). In total, enrollment of graduate students was down 399 to 10,172 (-3.8%) and enrollment of graduate professional students was down 7 to 3,269 (-0.2%).

- Four undergraduate curricular academic programs saw an increase in enrollment from Autumn Quarter 2004 in excess of ten percent. They are Arts and Sciences, Unknown (up 13 to 83; 18.6%), Dental Hygiene (up 22 to 155, 16.5%), Allied Medical Professions (up 242 to 1,326; 22.3%), and Pharmacy (up 83 to 418; 24.8%). One undergraduate curricular program, Journalism, saw a decrease in excess of ten percent (down 42 to 146; -22.3%). Graduate level programs that recorded changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent are the graduate programs in Arts and Sciences, General (down 1 to 0; -100.0%), Journalism (down 34 to 0; -100.0%), Human Ecology (down 12 to 96; -11.1%), Allied Medical Professions (up 46 to 260; 21.5%), Other Graduate Interdisciplinary (down 100 to 716; -12.3%), Medicine (up 54 to 399; 15.7%) and Optometry (up 2 to 14; 16.7%). - Credits generated by full-time undergraduates increased at Columbus (up 5,862 to 541,044; 1.1%) and at the extended campuses as a whole (up 607 to 85,382; 0.7%). The net result was a total increase of 6,469 to 626,426 (1.0%) from Autumn Quarter 2004. Credits generated by part-time undergraduates at Columbus decreased 9.3% (down 2,587 to 25,131) and the extended campuses decreased as a whole 1,206 to 9,812; (-10.9%). The net result was a decrease of 3,793 to 34,943 (-9.8%). An increase of 2,676 to 661,369 (0.4%) in credits generated by both full-time and part-time undergraduates for the entire university was reported. As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level throughout the university increased, so did credits per student (up 0.13 to 14.93; 0.9%). At the graduate level, there was an overall decrease in credits (down 3,063 to 117,789; -2.5%). The Columbus campus reported a decrease of credits generated by graduate students (down 3,550 to 113,895; -3.0%) while the extended campuses as a whole reported an increase of 487 to 3,894 (14.3%). Graduate professional credits per student were down 1.2% while both headcount (down 7 to 3,269; -0.2%) and credits (down 941 to 64,553; -1.4%) also decreased. Undergraduate FTE increased from 43,913 to 44,091. Graduate professional FTE decreased from 4,366 to 4,303. Graduate FTE decreased from 8,057 to 7853. [Table 4]
- For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Autumn Quarter 2004: Brown (up 34.2%), Harrison (up 36.4%), Holmes (up 25.4%), Morgan (down 22.2%), Noble (down 22.2%), and Vinton (up 35.7%). At Columbus, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative): Adams (down 21.1%), Brown (up 24.3%), Harrison (up 21.1%), Morgan (down 20.7%), Noble (down 29.2%), and Vinton (up 21.4%). - For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Autumn Quarter 2004 were: Georgia (up 23.6%), South Carolina (down 29.4%), Puerto Rico (down 24.5%), New Hampshire (up 26.9%), Alaska (up 23.5%), New Mexico (down 32.3%), Vermont (down 21.7%), Montana (down 46.7%) and Guam (down 50.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Autumn Quarter are: Georgia (up 22.8%), South Carolina (down 29.9%), Puerto Rico (down 24.5%), New Mexico (down 32.3%), Alaska (up 23.5%), Vermont (down 26.1%), Montana (down 46.7%) and Guam (down 50.0%). ## Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at The Ohio State University, Indonesia (down 28.4%), Mexico (down 21.9%) Nigeria (up 33.3%), Pakistan (down 28.6%), and Russia (down 33.3%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from Autumn Quarter 2004. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Taiwan, Indonesia, Japan, and Turkey recorded enrollment of 100 or more students in Autumn Quarter 2005. [Table 9]
- On the Columbus campus, Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 10.2 percent. Undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Business (7.8%) and Engineering (6.5%). Undergraduate international enrollment was 1,202 for the total university and 1,186 on the Columbus campus. On Columbus campus, forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (48.1%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (47.4%), Engineering (59.6%), Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences (45.4%), Pharmacy (66.0%), and the graduate program in Veterinary Medicine (43.5%) were international students. For the entire university, a record high enrollment of 48 Professional international students was reached in Autumn Quarter 2005. [Table 10 and 12]
- At the Undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 28 to 39,887; -0.1%) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents also decreased (down 183 to 4,420; -4.0%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 123 to 5,820; -2.1%); as well, enrollment of not-Ohio residents decreased (down 276 to 4,352; -6.0%). An increase was recorded in Graduate Professional enrollment among Ohio residents (up 1 to 2,958; 0.0%) while not-Ohio residents decreased (down 8 to 311; -2.5%). [Table 14]
