Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Autumn Quarter of 2006

October 11, 2006

Autumn Quarter began on September 20, 2006. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on October 9. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall increase in enrollment of 1,343 students, compared to Autumn Quarter 2005, was recorded for Autumn Quarter 2006. The Columbus campus increased by 1,314 to 51,818 (2.6%). The Lima campus increased 69 to 1,214 (6.0%), Marion campus increased 53 to 1,538 (3.6%) and the Newark campus increased 127 to 2,310 (5.8%). The Mansfield campus decreased 146 to 1,464 (-9.1%) and Wooster campus decreased 74 to 747 (-9.0%).
[Table 1]
- Increases in undergraduate enrollment (up 1,110 to 45,417; 2.5%) and graduate enrollment (up 246 to 10,418; 2.4%) and a decrease in graduate professional enrollment (down 13 to 3,256; -0.4%) were recorded this quarter. Four sources of total undergraduate enrollment experienced increases: New first-quarter freshmen (up 453 to 8,501; 5.6%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 128 to 1,539; 9.1%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 68 to 1,522; 4.7%), and continuing students (up 517 to 32,340; 1.6%). The source category that experienced a decrease was former students (down 56 to 1,515; -3.6%). At the extended campuses as a whole, three source categories recorded an increase: New first-quarter freshmen (up 151 to 2,339; 6.9%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 4 to 194; 2.1%), and transfer students above Rank 2 (up 42 to 452; 10.2%). The remaining categories, continuing students (down 63 to 3,593; -1.7%) and former students (down 92 to 360; -20.4%) saw decreases. All five sources of undergraduate enrollment at the Columbus campus experienced increases from Autumn Quarter 2005: New first-quarter freshmen students (up 302 to 6,162; 5.2%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 124 to 1,345; 10.2%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 26 to 1,070; 2.5%), continuing students (up 580 to 28,747; 2.1%), and former students (up 36 to 1,155; 3.2%). The enrollment of graduate students at Columbus campus for Autumn Quarter 2006 increased from Autumn Quarter 2005 (up 259 to 10,083; 2.6%) while the enrollment of graduate students at the extended campuses decreased (down 13 to 335; -3.7%). Overall, new graduate students (up 224 to 2,472; 10.0%) and former graduate students (up 100 to 514; 24.2%) were up while continuing graduate students (down 78 to 7,432; -1.0%) were down. In total, enrollment of graduate students was up 246 to 10,418 (2.4%) while enrollment of graduate professional students was down 13 to 3,256 (-0.4%). [Table 2]

- *Due to changes within the university community, changes to the content and structure of academic programs went into effect this quarter. In ascending order the changes are as follows: Students enrolled in the School of Earth Sciences are now reported separately from but also within the College of Mathematical and Physical Sciences. The School of Communication is listed with the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences, but is also separately reported. With the creation of the new College of Education and Human Ecology, the enrollment counts from the previous year for the College of Education and the College of Human Ecology have been combined and will no longer be reported separately. The Exploration Program is another new addition to Table 3. Students enrolled in the School of Environment and Natural Resources are now counted within this school as well as within the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences. Two new Graduate Programs are being reported in Table 3: The John Glenn School of Public Affairs and the School of Public Health.*
Seven undergraduate curricular academic programs saw an increase in enrollment from Autumn Quarter 2005 in excess of ten percent. They are: Arts and Sciences, General (up 280 to 1,108; 33.8%), Earth Sciences (up 8 to 57; 16.3%), Dental Hygiene (up 24 to 179; 15.5%), Education and Human Ecology (up 334 to 3,439; 10.8%), Nursing (up 95 to 968; 10.9%), Pharmacy (up 72 to 490; 17.2%) and Undergraduate Student Academic Services (up 60 to 225; 36.4%). Two undergraduate curricular programs saw a decrease in excess of ten percent: Arts and Sciences, Unknown (down 40 to 43; -48.2%), and Exploration Program (down 620 to 3,171; -16.4%). Graduate level programs that recorded changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent are: Allied Medical Professions (up 28 to 288; 10.8%), Nursing (up 31 to 277; 12.6%), Public Health (up 32 to 284; 12.7%), Social Work (up 61 to 450; 15.7%), Law (up 1 to 2; 100.0%), Medicine (up 28 to 175; 19.0%) and Optometry (down 2 to 12; -14.3%). - Credits generated by full-time undergraduates increased at Columbus (up 19,204 to 560,248; 3.5%) and at the extended campuses as a whole (up 1,503 to 86,885; 1.8%). The net result was a total increase of 20,707 to 647,133 (3.3%) from Autumn Quarter 2005. Credits generated by part-time undergraduates at Columbus decreased 4.4% (down 1,094 to 24,037) and the extended campuses decreased as a whole 528 to 9,284; (-5.4%). The net result was a decrease of 1,622 to 33,321 (-4.6%). An increase of 19,085 to 680,454 (2.9%) in credits generated by both full-time and part-time undergraduates for the entire university was reported. As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level throughout the university increased, so did credits per student (up 0.06 to 14.98; 0.4%). At the graduate level, there was an overall increase in credits (up 4,035 to 121,824; 3.4%). The Columbus campus reported an increase of credits generated by graduate students (up 4,151 to 118,046; 3.6%) while the extended campuses as a whole reported a decrease of 116 to 3,778 (-3.0%). Graduate professional credits per student were down 0.3% while both headcount (down 13 to 3,256; -0.4%) and credits (down 439 to 64,114; -0.7%) also decreased. Undergraduate FTE increased from 44,091 to 45,364. Graduate professional FTE decreased from 4,303 to 4,274. Graduate FTE increased from 7,853 to 8,122. [Table 4]
- For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Autumn Quarter 2005: Adams (up 43.8%), Brown (down 21.6%), Hocking (up 21.7%), Jackson (up 29.2%), Morgan (down 39.3%), and Scioto (up 21.1%). At Columbus, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative): Brown (down 21.7%), Carroll (down 27.6%), Darke (up 22.6%), Harrison (up 30.4%), Hocking (up 22.6%), Jackson (29.8%), Monroe (down 22.6%), Morgan (down 34.8%), and Scioto (up 20.6%). - For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Autumn Quarter 2004 were: Alaska (up 23.8%), Maine (up 22.2%), Nevada (up 42.9%), Montana (up 50.0%), Wyoming (up 25.0%), North Dakota (down 30.8%), South Dakota (up 50.0%), the Virgin Islands (up 50.0%) and Guam (down 100.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Autumn Quarter are: Alaska (up 23.8%), Maine (up 22.2%), Nevada (up 42.9%), Montana (up 50.0%), North Dakota (down 30.8%), South Dakota (up 50.0%), the Virgin Islands (up 50.0%) and Guam (down 100.0%). Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at The Ohio State University, Indonesia (down 28.9%), Malaysia (down 23.5%), Saudi Arabia (up 290.0%), Jamaica (up 212.5%), Romania (down 25.0%), Argentina (down 21.7%), Colombia (up 30.8%) and Italy (up 21.4%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from Autumn Quarter 2005. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Taiwan, Indonesia, Japan, Canada and Turkey recorded enrollment of 100 or more students in Autumn Quarter 2006. [Table 9]
- On the Columbus campus, Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 12.6 percent. The undergraduate curricular academic program with international student enrollment in excess of five percent was Business (6.5%). Undergraduate international enrollment was 1,086 for the total university and 1,078 on the Columbus campus. On Columbus campus, forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (46.0%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (46.3%), Engineering (56.5%), Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences (45.6%), and Pharmacy (59.8%) were international students. [Table 10 and 12]
- At the Undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 1,200 to 41,087; 3.0%) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents decreased (down 90 to 4,330; -2.0%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 215 to 6,035; 3.7%); as well, enrollment of not-Ohio residents increased (up 31 to 4,383; 0.7%). An decrease was recorded in Graduate Professional enrollment among Ohio residents (down 60 to 2,898; -2.0%) while not-Ohio residents increased (up 47 to 358; 15.1%). [Table 14]
- Autumn 2006 had a record high enrollment of 241 for American Indian or Alaskan Native students, a record high enrollment of 2,887 for Asian or Pacific Islander students and a record high enrollment of 1,305 for Hispanic students. A record high of 29,469 total female students was reached for the entire university.
