Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Spring Quarter of 2001

April 19, 2001

Spring Quarter 2001 began on March 26, 2001. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on April 9th. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall decrease in enrollment of 106 students compared to Spring Quarter 2000 was recorded for this quarter for a total of 50,822. Two of the regional campuses experienced enrollment increases; Marion (up 50 to 1,119; 4.7%) and Newark (up 123 to 1,670; 8.0%). The three other regional campuses combined with the Columbus campus accounted for the overall decrease in enrollment; Lima (down 76 to 1,092; -6.5%), Mansfield (down 55 to 1,266; -4.2%), Wooster (down 4 to 759; -0.5%), and Columbus (down 144 to 44,916; -0.3%). [Table 1]

- The increases in undergraduate (up 84 to 38,680; 0.2%) and graduate professional enrollment (up 70 to 2,781; 2.6%) were not large enough to offset the decrease in graduate enrollment (down 260 to 9,361; -2.7%). The sources contributing to the undergraduate enrollment increase were new first-quarter freshmen (up 59 to 362; 19.5%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (up 10 to 276; 3.8%), and former students (up 126 to 1,609; 8.5%). Transfer students above rank 2 (down 11 to 440; -2.4%) and continuing students (down 100 to 35,993; -0.3%) were the two sources of undergraduates that experienced enrollment decreases. The extended campuses combined had an increase of 95 undergraduate students, up 1.8%. The sources contributing to the undergraduate enrollment increase on the extended campuses were new first-quarter freshmen (up 42 to 113; 59.2%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (up 18 to 48; 60.0%), continuing students (up 80 to 4,893; 1.7%). Extended campuses, as a whole, experienced decreases in undergraduate enrollment from transfer students above rank 2 (down 36 to 96; -27.3%) and former students (down 9 to 339; -2.6%). The sources of undergraduate enrollment increase on the Columbus campus were new first-quarter freshmen (up 17 to 249; 7.3%), transfer students above rank 2 (up 25 to 344; 7.8%), and former students (up 135 to 1,270; 11.9%). Decreases in undergraduate enrollment on the Columbus campus were from transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 8 to 228; -3.4%) and continuing students (down 180 to 31,100; -0.6%). Overall graduate student enrollment decreased 2.7% (down 260 to 9,361). The extended campuses combined illustrated a decrease of 57 graduate students, down 12.0% and the Columbus campus experienced a decline of 203 graduate students, down 2.2% from the Spring of 2000. The overall enrollment of new graduate students is 289, down 8.0% from the Spring 2000. The overall enrollment of continuing graduate students is also down 45 students (0.5%) and returning graduate students declined 190 (-19.9% to 765). Enrollment of graduate professional students is up 70 to 2,781 (2.6%). A record Spring quarter high of 362 new first-quarter freshmen was reached this quarter. [Table 2]

- Five undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw a decrease in enrollment from Spring 2000 in excess of ten percent. They were Arts and Sciences, Unknown (down 183 to 102; -64.2%), Education (down 90 to 326; -21.6%), Natural Resources (down 72 to 234; -23.5%), Pharmacy (down 38 to 214; -15.1%), and University College (down 1625 to 8,686; -15.8%). Five undergraduate programs also illustrated an increase of ten percent or greater: The Arts (up 566 to 1,505; 60.3%), Biological Sciences (up 229 to 1,511; 17.9%), Business (up 240 to 2,640; 10.0%), Architecture (up 128 to 436; 41.6%), and Allied Medical Professions (up 64 to 470; 15.8%). Graduate programs reporting changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent were: Business (up 105 to 654; 19.1%), Education (down 628 to 2,096; -23.1%), Natural Resources (down 10 to 58; -14.7%), Human Ecology (down 17 to 112; -13.2%), Allied Medical Professions (down 17 to 50; -25.4%), and the graduate program in Dentistry (up 10 to 85; 13.3%). Of the graduate professional programs Pharmacy was the only program to record a change (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent (up 39 to 180; 27.7%). [Table 3]

- Credits generated by full time undergraduates at Columbus increased 1.6% (to 434,205) and increased for the extended campuses as a whole 5.0% (to 56,919). The net increase in full-time undergraduate credit hours was 9,438, up 2.0% from the Spring of 2000. Overall, part-time credit hours decreased (down 1,967 to 52,074; -3.6%). The Columbus campus (-3.4%) and the extended campuses (-4.4) experienced a decrease in total part-time credit hours. As a result, the total number of credit hours increased 7,471 to 543,198 (up 1.4%) and the credits per student also increased to 14.04 (up 0.16; 1.2%). Although there was a decrease in the number of graduate students, the number of total graduate credit hours increased 1,106 to 97,488 (1.1%). Full-time graduate credit hours increased 2.4% to 76,988 on the Columbus campus and 24.7% to 2,404 on the extended campuses as a whole, thus resulting in an overall full-time graduate credit hour increase of 2.9% to 79,392. Graduate credits per student for the entire university were up 0.4 to 10.41 (4.0%). Graduate professional credit hours were down 1,877 to 49,456 (-3.7%) and credits per student were down 6.1% (down 1.15 to 17.78). Undergraduate FTE increased from 35,715 from Spring 2000 to 36,213. Graduate professional FTE decreased from 3,422 to 3,297. Graduate FTE increased to 6,499 from 6,426. [Table 5]

- For the total university, only one county recorded enrollment changes (positive or negative) in excess of twenty percent from last Spring; Preble (up 25.0%). For the Columbus campus, four counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent: Carroll (down 23.3%), Morgan (up 22.2%), Pike (down 21.6%), Coshocton (up 33.3%) and Preble (up 29.3%). Overall, enrollment from U.S. territories decreased 22.4%. [Table 6 and Table 7]

- For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Utah (up 24.7%), Connecticut (down 20.2%), Puerto Rico (down 26.2%), Arizona (down 24.4%), Nevada (up 25.0%), Hawaii (up 29.4), Idaho (up 38.5%), Montana (up 66.7%), Virgin Islands (up 25.0%), and Wyoming (down 55.6%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Utah (up 23.3%), Puerto Rico (down 26.2%), Arizona (down 24.4%), Nevada (up 25%), Rhode Island (up 27.3%), Hawaii (up 29.4), Virgin Islands (up 25.0%), Idaho (up 38.5%), Vermont (down 20%), and Wyoming (down 55.6%). Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, India (up 31.7%), Romania (up 40%), Bangladesh (up 31.8%), England (down 24.3%), Spain (up 44.4%), Nigeria (up 108.3%), and Brazil (up 53.3%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Spring Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Taiwan, Japan and Turkey recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 10]
- Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 15.9 percent. Undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Arts and Sciences, General (5.4%), Business (11.8%), Engineering (8.1%), and Architecture (5.3%). International undergraduate student enrollment was 1,482. Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (41.8%), Journalism (51.4%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (51.0%), Engineering (69.3%), Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (45.2%), and Pharmacy (40.5%) were international students. International graduate student enrollment was 2,419, and international graduate professional students enrollment was 24; these are both record highs for Spring quarter. [Table 11]
- Spring Quarter record high enrollments among American Indians or Alaskan Natives (194 total) and Hispanics (862 total) were reached this quarter. [Tables 12, 13, and 14]
- At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 63 to 34,580; -0.2%) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents increased (up 147 to 4,100; 3.7%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 418 to 5,528; -7.0%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 158 to 3,833; 4.3%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents increased 58 to 2,580 (up 2.3%) and not-Ohio residents increased 12 to 201 (up 6.3%). [Table 15]
- Record high enrollment of 1,384 female Graduate Professional students was reached this Spring Quarter. [Table 16]
