Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Spring Quarter of 2002

April 23, 2002

Spring Quarter 2002 began on April 1, 2002. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on April 15th. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall increase in enrollment of 1,926 students compared to Spring Quarter 2001 was recorded for this quarter for a total of 52,748. Five of the regional campuses experienced enrollment increases; Lima (up 122 to 1,214; 11.2%), Mansfield (up 20 to 1,286; 1.6%), Marion (up 202 to 1,321; 18.1%), and Newark (up 54 to 1,724; 3.3%). These increases combined with the enrollment increase of 1,539 students on the Columbus campus (up 3.4% to 46,455) comprised the overall enrollment increase. Wooster campus experienced an enrollment decrease (down 11 to 748, -1.4%). [Table 1]
- The increases in undergraduate (up 1,040 to 39,720; 2.7%), graduate professional (up 156 to 2,937; 5.6%), and graduate enrollment (up 730 to 10,091; 7.8%) all contributed to the overall enrollment increase. The sources contributing to the undergraduate enrollment increase were other transfer students (up 7 to 447; 1.6%) and continuing students (up 1,225 to 37,218; 3.4%). The remaining sources experienced decreases. New first-quarter freshmen (down 76 to 286; -21%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 10 to 266; -3.6%), and former students (down 106 to 1,503; -6.6%). The extended campuses combined had an increase of 396 undergraduate students, up 7.2%. Continuing students accounted for the undergraduate enrollment increase on the extended campuses (up 431 to 5,324; 8.8%). Extended campuses, as a whole, experienced decreases in undergraduate enrollment from new first quarter freshmen (down 7 to 106; -6.2%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 2 to 46; -4.2%), transfer students above rank 2 (down 19 to 77; -19.8%) and former students (down 7 to 332; -2.1%). The sources of undergraduate enrollment increase on the Columbus campus were other transfers (up 26 to 370, 7.6%) and continuing students (up 794 to 31,894; 2.6%). The remaining sources decreased; New first-quarter freshmen (down 69 to 180; -27.7%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 8 to 220; -3.5%), and former students (down 99 to 1,171; -7.8%).

Overall graduate student enrollment increased 7.8% (up 730 to 10,091). The extended campuses combined illustrated a decrease of 9 graduate students, down 2.2% while the Columbus campus experienced an increase of 739 graduate students, up 8.3% from the Spring of 2001. The overall enrollment of new graduate students is 418, up 44.6% from the Spring 2001. The overall enrollment of continuing graduate students is up 349 students (4.2%) and returning graduate students increased 252 (32.9% to 1,017). Enrollment of graduate professional students is up 156 to 2,937 (5.6%). [Table 2]

- Thirteen undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw an increase in enrollment from Spring 2001 in excess of ten percent. They were Arts and Sciences, Unknown (up 320 to 422; 313.7%), Biological Sciences (up 363 to 1,874; 24%), Humanities (up 242 to 2,440; 11.0%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (up 585 to 1,190; 96.7%), Social and Behavioral Sciences (up 1,393 to 5,781; 31.7%), Business (up 1,083 to 3,723; 41.0%), Dental Hygiene (up 39 to 123; 46.4%), Engineering (up 397 to 4,188; 10.5%), Architecture (up 167 to 603; 38.3%), Natural Resources (up 143 to 377; 61.1%), Human Ecology (up 740 to 2,285; 47.9%), Allied Medical Professions (up 230 to 700; 48.9%). Six undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw a decrease in enrollment Spring 2001. They were Arts and Sciences, General (down 930 to 376; 71.2%), The Arts (down 193 to 1,312; 12.8%), Journalism (down 83 to 201; 29.2%), Continuing Education (down 159 to 860; 15.6%), Pharmacy (down 30 to 184; 14.0%), Undergraduate Student Academic Services (down 3,981 to 4,705; 45.8%). These enrollment shifts for undergraduate curricular programs can be attributed to the changes within the College of Arts and Sciences and the trend toward direct enrollment at The Ohio State University. Graduate level programs recording changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent with the indicated number and percent change were: Journalism (up 5 to 40; 14.3%), Business (up 71 to 725; 10.9%), Natural Resources (up 7 to 65; 12.1%), Human Ecology (up 12 to 124; 10.7%), Allied Medical Professions (up 67 to 117, 134.0%), Nursing (up 18 to 193; 10.3%), Other Graduate Interdisciplinary (up 362 to 886; 69.1%), the graduate program in Optometry (up 3 to 14; 27.3%), and the graduate program in Veterinary Medicine (up 23 to 119; 24.0%). The graduate professional program in Pharmacy recorded an increase of 63.9%, an increase of 115 to 295. [Table 3]
- Credits generated by full time undergraduates at Columbus increased 4.5% (to 453,858) and increased for the extended campuses as a whole 10.9% (to 63,829). The net increase in full-time undergraduate credit hours was 26,563, up 5.4% from the Spring of 2001. Overall, part-time credit hours decreased (down 3,043 to 49,031; -5.8%). The Columbus campus (-7.5%) and the extended campuses (-0.6) experienced a decrease in total part-time credit hours. As a result, the total number of credit hours increased 23,520 to 566,718 (up 4.3%) and the credits per student also increased to 14.27 (up 0.22; 1.6%). With the increase in the number of graduate students, the number of total graduate credit hours increased 7,920 to 105,408 (8.1%). Full-time graduate credit hours increased 9.9% to 84,616 on the Columbus campus and decreased 25.7% to 1,785 on the extended campuses as a whole, thus resulting in an overall full-time graduate credit hour increase of 8.8% to 86,401. Graduate credits per student for the entire university were up 0.03 to 10.45 (0.3%). Graduate professional credit hours were up 5,540 to 54,996 (11.2%) and credits per student were up 5.3% (up 0.94 to 18.73). Undergraduate FTE increased from 36,213 from Spring 2001 to 37,781. Graduate professional FTE increased from 3,297 to 3,666. Graduate FTE increased to 7,027 from 6,499. [Table 5]
- For the total university, six counties recorded enrollment changes (positive or negative) in excess of twenty percent from last Spring; Brown (up 28.0%), Clinton (up 20.7%), Darke (up 20.6%), Gallia (down 20.4%), Highland (up 29.5%) and Vinton (up 50.0%). For the Columbus campus, four counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent: Brown (up 33.3%), Clinton (up 24.4%), Highland (up 25.0%) and Vinton (up 60.0%). [Table 5 and Table 6]
- For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Wisconsin (up 30.9%), Utah (up 30.8%), Arizona (up 41.2%), Kansas (up 22.2%), District of Columbia (up 50.0%), Idaho (up 27.8%), Mississippi (up 28.6%), Montana (up 140.0%), Vermont (up 50.0%), and South Dakota (down 30.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Wisconsin (up 30.1%), Massachusetts (up 20.2%), Utah (up 31.1%), Arizona (up 41.2%), District of Columbia (up 50.0%), Idaho (up 27.8%), Mississippi (up 21.4%), Montana (up 140.0%), Vermont (up 37.5%), and South Dakota (down 30.0%).. [Table 7 and Table 8]

Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, Malaysia (up 35.7%), England (up 21.4%), Mexico (up 35.3%), and United Arab Emirates (up 40%) experienced enrollment changes in excess of twenty-percent. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Taiwan, Japan, Canada and Turkey recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]
- Undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Mathematical and Physical Sciences (up 6.3%), Business (10.4%), Continuing Education (10.7%), and Engineering (8.0%). International undergraduate student enrollment was 1,504 (up 4.5% from Spring 2001). Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (44.2%), Journalism (50%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (50.4%), Engineering (71%), Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (46.2%), and Pharmacy (54.7%) were international students. International graduate student enrollment was 2,589, and international graduate professional students enrollment was 30; these are both record highs for Spring quarter. [Table 10]
- Spring Quarter record high enrollments among African Americans (3,681 total), American Indians (224 total), Asian or Pacific Islanders (2,440), and Hispanics (905) were reached this quarter. [Tables 11, 12, and 13]
- At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 766 to 35,346; 2.2%) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents increased (up 274 to 4,374; 6.7%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 475 to 6,003; 8.6%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 255 to 4,088; 6.7%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents increased 127 to 2,707 (up 4.9%) and not-Ohio residents increased 29 to 230 (up 14.4%). [Table 14]
- Record high enrollment of 1,501 female Graduate Professional students was reached this Spring Quarter. [Table 16]
- Record high enrollment of 27,077 female students was reached this Spring Quarter. [Table 1]
