Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Spring Quarter of 2003

April 18, 2003

Spring Quarter 2003 began on March 31, 2003. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on April 17th. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

An overall increase in enrollment of 939 students compared to Spring Quarter 2002 was recorded for this quarter for a total of 53,687. All of the regional campuses experienced enrollment decreases; Lima (down 12 to 1,202; -1.0% ), Mansfield (down 12 to 1,274; -0.9%), Marion (down 46 to 1,275; -3.5%), Newark (down 51 to 1,673; -3.0%) and Wooster (down 66 to 682; -8.8%). The increase on the Columbus campus (up 1,126 to 47,581; 2.4%) offset the regional decreases to net an overall increase. [Table 1]

The increases in undergraduate (up 900 to 40,620; 2.3%) and graduate professional enrollment (up 126 to 3,063; 4.3%) were large enough to offset the decrease in graduate enrollment (down 87 to 10,004; -0.9%). The source contributing to the undergraduate enrollment increase was continuing students (up 1,266 to 38,484; 3.4%). The remaining sources of undergraduates enrollment; new first-quarter freshmen (down 77 to 209; -26.9%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 13 to 253; -4.9%), Transfer students above rank 2 (down 22 to 425; -4.9%) and former students (down 254 to 1,249; -16.9%) experienced enrollment decreases. The extended campuses combined had a decrease of 117 undergraduate students, down 2.0%. All but one of the sources contributed to the undergraduate enrollment decrease on the extended campuses as New first-quarter freshmen (down 17 to 89; -16.0%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 5 to 41; -10.9%), continuing students (down 56 to 5,268; -1.1%) and former students (down 56 to 276; -16.9%) all decreased. Only transfer students above rank 2 (up 17 to 94; 22.1%) at the extended campuses, as a whole, experienced an increase in undergraduate enrollment. The only source of undergraduate enrollment to increase on the Columbus campus was continuing students (up 1,322 to 33,216; 4.1%). This offset decreases in the remaining sources as New first-quarter freshmen (down 60 to 120; -33.3%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 8 to 212; -3.6%), transfer students above rank 2 (down 39 to 331; -10.5%), and former students (down 198 to 973; -16.9%). Overall graduate student enrollment decreased 0.9% (down 87 to 10,004). The extended campuses combined illustrated a decrease of 70 graduate students, down 17.2% and the Columbus campus experienced a decline of 17 graduate students, down 0.2% from the Spring of 2002. The overall enrollment of new graduate students is 325, down 22.3% from the Spring 2002. The overall enrollment of continuing graduate students is up 207 students (2.4%) and returning graduate students declined 201 (-19.8% to 816). Enrollment of graduate professional students is up 126 to 3,063 (4.3%) setting a record high for Spring quarter. [Table 2]

Two undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw a decrease in enrollment from Spring 2002 in excess of ten percent. They were Arts and Sciences, Unknown (down 261 to 161; -61.8%), and Undergraduate Student Academic Services (USAS)(down 835 to 3,870; -17.7%). Five undergraduate programs show an increase of ten percent or greater: Arts and Sciences, General (up 191 to 567; 50.8%), Business (up 516 to 4,239; 13.9%), Education (up 263 to 598; 78.5%), Human Ecology (up 233 to 2,518; 10.2%), and Nursing (up 221 to 623; 55.0%). Graduate programs reporting changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent were: Business (up 122 to 847; 16.8%), Allied Medical Professions (up 26 to 143; 22.2%), Nursing (up 34 to 227; 17.6%), and the graduate program in Medicine (up 25 to 253; 11.1%). Of the graduate professional programs, Pharmacy was the only program to record a change (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent (up 113 to 408; 38.3%). [Table 3]

Credits generated by full time undergraduates at Columbus increased 4.7% (to 475,035) and decreased for the extended campuses as a whole 0.4% (to 63,600). The net increase in full-time undergraduate credit hours was 20,948, up 4.0% from the Spring of 2002. Overall, part-time credit hours decreased (down 2,712 to 46,319; -5.5%). The Columbus campus (-5.4%) and the extended campuses (-5.8%) experienced a decrease in total part-time credit hours. Overall, the total number of credit hours increased 18,236 to 584,954 (up 3.2%) and the credits per student also increased to 14.40 (up 0.13; 0.9%). Although there was a decrease in the number of graduate students, the number of total graduate credit hours increased 2,610 to 108,018 (2.5%). Full-time graduate credit hours increased 3.4% to 87,462 on the Columbus campus and decreased 2.9% to 1,733 on the extended campuses as a whole, thus resulting in an overall full-time graduate credit hour increase of 3.2% to 89,195. Graduate credits per student for the entire university were up 0.35 to 10.80 (3.4%). Graduate professional credit hours were up 1,381 to 56,377, 2.5%) however credits per student were down 1.7% to 18.41. Undergraduate FTE increased from 37,781 from Spring 2002 to 38,997. Graduate professional FTE increased from 3,666 to 3,759. Graduate FTE increased to 7,027 from 7,201. [Table 4]

For the total university, five counties recorded enrollment changes (positive or negative) in excess of twenty percent from last Spring; Adams (down 33.3%), Defiance (up 30.7%), Harrison (down 25.7%), Vinton (up 77.8%) and Williams (up 24.6%). For the Columbus campus, seven counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent: Adams (down 35.6%), Defiance (up 29.9%), Harrison (down 24.1%), Morgan (up 25.0%), Paulding (up 21.9%), Vinton (up 87.5%) and Williams (up 20.6%). For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Utah (up 22.7%), Arizona (up 33.3%), Idaho (up 47.8%), Nebraska (down 22.2%), Alaska (up 35.7%), Vermont (up 50.0), Nevada (down 23.8%), North Dakota (down 38.5%), Wyoming (up 75.0%), South Dakota (down 28.6%), Virgin Islands (down 60.0%), and Guam (down 100.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Texas (up 20.2%), Utah (up 23.7%), Arizona (up 33.3%), Idaho (up 47.8%), Alaska (up 35.7%), Vermont (up 54.5), Nevada (down 23.8%), North Dakota (down 38.5%), Wyoming (up 75.0%), South Dakota (down 28.6%), Virgin Islands (down 60.0%), and Guam (down 100.0%) [Table 7 and Table 8]

Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, Malaysia (up 35.1%), England (down 26.5%), Brazil (up 37.5%), Spain (down 29.0%), Bangladesh (down 23.1%), and Argentina (up 70.0%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Spring Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Taiwan, Japan, Turkey and Canada recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]

Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 11.6 percent. Undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Business (11.6%) and Engineering (8.7%). International undergraduate student enrollment was a record 1,519 for the Columbus campus and 1,524 for Total University . Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (47.1%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (48.9%), Engineering (67.5%), Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (44.9%), and Pharmacy (58.9%) were international students. International graduate student enrollment at Columbus was 2,599 and the total university was 2,601, both are Spring quarter record highs. International graduate professional students enrollment was 41 and a Spring quarter record high as well. [Table 10]

Spring Quarter record high enrollments among African Americans (3,736 total), Asian or Pacific Islanders (2,508) and Hispanics (997 total) were reached this quarter. [Tables 11, 12, and 13]

At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased 2.0% (up 715 to 36,061) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents increased 4.2% (up 185 to 4,559). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 93 to 5,910; -1.5%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 6 to 4,094; 0.1%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents increased 108 to 2,815 (up 4.0%) and not-Ohio residents increased 18 to 248 (up 7.8%). [Table 14]

Record high enrollment of 1,606 female Graduate Professional students was reached this Spring Quarter.
