Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Summer Quarter of 2009

August 18, 2009

Summer Quarter began on June 22, 2009. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on August 10. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- There was an overall decrease in enrollment for Summer Quarter 2009 compared to Summer Quarter 2008 (down 24 to 21,054; -0.1%). Four campuses had increases in enrollment: Lima (up 43 to 432; 11.1%), Mansfield (up 18 to 404; 4.7%), Marion (up 1 to 475; 0.2%), and Newark (up 13 to 584; 2.3%). Two campuses had decreases in enrollment: Columbus (down 56 to 19,035; -0.3%), and Wooster (down 43 to 124; -25.7%). [Table 1]
- Undergraduate enrollment increased this quarter (up 21 to 12,306; 0.2%), as well as graduate professional enrollment (up 59 to 1,156; 5.4%). Graduate enrollment decreased (down 104 to 7,592; -1.4%).

A new source category of "non-degree" has been added since the *Highlights of Fifteenth Day Enrollment for Summer 2008* was published last year. The enrollments in the source categories for Summer 2008 have been recalculated to include the non-degree category to facilitate enrollment source comparisons to this year's *Highlights of Fifteenth Day Enrollment for Summer 2009*.

Three of six source categories of total undergraduate enrollment increased: new first-quarter freshman (up 9 to 215; 4.4%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (up 24 to 130; 22.6%), continuing students (up 88 to 10,236; 0.9%). The three remaining source categories decreased: transfer students above rank 2 (down 40 to 136; -22.7%), former students (down 18 to 425; -4.1%), and non-degree students (down 42 to 1,164; -3.5%).

At the Columbus campus, two undergraduate source categories increased: transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (up 12 to 94; 14.6%), and continuing students (up 13 to 8,940; 0.1%). The remaining four source categories decreased: new first-quarter freshmen (down 1 to 130; -0.8%), transfer students above rank 2 (down 26 to 117; -18.2%), former students (down 12 to 339; -3.4%), and non-degree students (down 35 to 1,002; -3.4%).

At the extended campuses as a whole, three undergraduate source categories increased: new first-quarter freshman (up 10 to 85; 13.3%), transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (up 12 to 36; 50.0%), and continuing students (up 75 to 1,296; 6.1%). The remaining three source categories decreased: transfer students above rank 2 (down 14 to 19; -42.4%), former students (down 6 to 86; -6.5%), and non-degree students (down 7 to 162; -4.1%).

The enrollment of graduate students at the Columbus campus for Summer Quarter 2009 decreased from Summer Quarter 2008 (down 66 to 7,257; -0.9%), as well as enrollment of graduate students at the extended campuses (down 38 to 335; -10.2%). Total university enrollment increased for new graduate students (up 103 to 780; 15.2%), and non-degree graduate students (up 74 to 1,062; 7.5%), but decreased for continuing graduate students (down 141 to 5,396; -2.5%), and former graduate students (down 140 to 354; -28.3%). - At the Columbus campus, six undergraduate curricular programs saw an increase in enrollment from Summer Quarter 2008 in excess of ten percent. They were: Mathematical and Physical Sciences (up 34 to 337; 11.2%), Engineering (up 116 to 999; 13.1%), Environment and Natural Resources (up 16 to 94; up 20.5%), Food, Agriculture, and Environmental Science (up 53 to 316; 20.2%), Pharmacy (up 12 to 128; 10.3%), and Social Work (up 9 to 85; 11.8%). Six undergraduate programs saw a decrease in excess of ten percent: Art and Sciences, Unknown (down 12 to 0; -100.0%), the Arts (down 35 to 271; -11.4%), Music (down 10 to 41; -19.6%), Biological Sciences (down 96 to 689; -12.2%), Dental Hygiene (down 10 to 47; -17.5%), and Undergraduate Student Academic Services (down 27 to 82; -24.8%). At the graduate level, two programs recorded enrollment increases in excess of ten percent: Biological Sciences (up 67 to 403; 19.9%), and Medicine (up 22 to 180; 13.9%). Three graduate programs saw decreases in excess of ten percent: Earth Sciences (down 8 to 27; -22.9%), Architecture (down 9 to 45; -16.7%), and Optometry (down 5 to 7; -41.7%). [Table 3]
- For the total university, credits generated by undergraduates increased (up 1,229 to 128,883; 1.0%) from Summer Quarter 2008. There was a net decrease for Columbus undergraduate credits (down 27 to 112,533; -0.02%) with full-time credits up (224 to 73,690; 0.3%) and part-time credits down (-251 to 38,843; -0.6%). At the extended campuses as a whole, there was an increase of undergraduate credits (up 1,256 to 16,350; 8.3%), full-time credits were up (1,042 to 8,728; 13.6%) as well as part-time credits (up 214 to 7,622; 2.9%). As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level throughout the university increased, so did credits per student (up 0.08 to 10.47; 0.8%). At the graduate level for the total university, there was a decrease in credits (down 13,142 to 59,778; -18.0%). Columbus graduate credits were down (-12,957 to 57,776; -18.3%), as well as extended campus graduate credits (-185 to 2,002; -8.5%). Graduate professional credits increased (up 360 to 16,615; 2.2%). Undergraduate FTE increased from 8,510 to 8,592. Graduate professional FTE increased from 1,084 to 1,108. Graduate FTE decreased from 4,861 to 3,985. [Table 4]
- For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Summer Quarter 2008: Adams (up 100.0%), Ashland (down -23.2%), Carroll (down -33.3%), Clinton (up 31.8%), Coshocton (down -20.5%), Erie (down -29.1%), Gallia (down -36.8%), Hardin (down -24.1%), Harrison (up 28.6%), Henry (up 21.1%), Highland (down -25.0%), Jefferson (down -21.7%), Lawrence (up 41.7%), Meigs (up 200.0%), Mercer (up 22.9%), Monroe (down -42.9%), Ottawa (down -26.5%), Perry (up 35.0%), Pike (up 37.5%), Preble (up 27.3%), Ross (down -39.8%), Sandusky (down -22.4%), Shelby (up 26.7%), Van Wert (up 21.7%), Vinton (down -66.7%), and Williams (down -21.9%). At Columbus, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Summer Quarter 2008: Adams (up 150.0%), Ashland (down -32.7%), Clinton (up 35.0%), Coshocton (down -27.6%), Erie (down -32.9%), Gallia (down -36.8%), Hardin (down -47.1%), Harrison (up 60.0%), Henry (up 25.0%), Highland (down -26.7%), Lawrence (up 41.7%), Logan (down -25.0%), Meigs (up 200.0%), Ottawa (down -24.2%), Pike (up 50.0%), Preble (up 33.3%), Putnam (up 23.1%), Ross (down -40.7%), Sandusky (down -27.7), Union (up 26.0%), Van Wert (up 52.2%), Vinton (down -66.7%), and Williams (down -20.7%). - For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from Summer Quarter 2008 were Texas (down -24.8%), Wisconsin (down -24.1%), Washington (down -31.3%), Connecticut (down -25.7%), South Carolina (down -23.5%), Oregon (up 33.3%), New Mexico (up 41.7%), Oklahoma (down -29.2%), Delaware (up 44.4%), Mississippi (down -21.4%), Nevada (down -41.2%), New Hampshire (down -41.2%), Arkansas (up 28.6%), Rhode Island (up 40.0%), Maine (down -37.5%), Montana (up 66.7%), Vermont (down -55.6%), and North Dakota (down -60.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from Summer Quarter 2008 were Texas (down -25.5%), Wisconsin (down -23.1%), Washington (down -33.3%), Connecticut (down -25.7%), South Carolina (down -23.5%), Oregon (up 33.3%), New Mexico (up 41.7%), Oklahoma (down -29.2%), Delaware (up 44.4%), Mississippi (down -21.4%), Nevada (down -41.2%), New Hampshire (down -41.2%), Arkansas (up 28.6%), Rhode Island (up 40.0%), Maine (down -28.6%), Montana (up 66.7%), Vermont (down -55.6%), and North Dakota (down -60.0%). ## Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at The Ohio State University, ten recorded changes in excess of twenty percent from Summer Quarter 2008. They were: Japan (down 25.5%), France (up 61.5%), Libyan Arab Jamahiriya (down -39.4%), Saudi Arabia (down -20.8), Malaysia (down -29.2%), Mexico (down -21.1%), Hong Kong (down -23.5%), and Brazil (down -38.9%), Italy (down -26.7%), and Nepal (up 83.3%). China, India, Republic of Korea, and Taiwan recorded enrollment of 100 or more students in Summer Quarter 2009. [Table 9]
- On the Columbus campus, Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 7.0 percent. Three undergraduate curricular programs had an international student enrollment in excess of five percent: Mathematical and Physical Sciences (8.3%), Business (15.7%), and Engineering (7.2%). Undergraduate international enrollment was 500 for the total university and 500 on the Columbus campus. On the Columbus campus, forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (49.6%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (42.2%), Engineering (59.1%), Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences (46.2%), and Pharmacy (65.1%) were international students. - At the undergraduate level, enrollment increased for Ohio residents (up 66 to 11,044; 0.6%) and decreased for not-Ohio residents (down 45 to 1,262; -3.4%). At the Graduate level, enrollment decreased for both Ohio residents (down 47 to 4,647; -1.0%) and not-Ohio residents (down 57 to 2,945; -1.9%). At the Graduate Professional level, enrollment increased for both Ohio residents (up 37 to 1,096; 3.5%) and not-Ohio residents (up 22 to 60; 57.9%). [Table 14]
