Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Winter Quarter of 2002

January 30, 2002

Winter Quarter 2002 began on January 7, 2002. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on January 21st. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall increase in enrollment of 1,430 students compared to Winter Quarter 2001 was recorded for this quarter for a total of 54,025. All but two campuses experienced increases in enrollment; Columbus (up 1,104 to 47,148; 2.4%), Lima (up 64 to 1,248; 5.4%), Marion (up 207 to 1,386; 17.6%) and Newark (up 85 to 1,965; 4.5%). Mansfield was down 28 to 1,387; (-2.0%) and Wooster decreased 2 to 891;(-0.2%). [Table 1]
  
- Increases in Undergraduate, Graduate and Graduate Professional enrollment all contributed to the increase in total enrollment. Undergraduate enrollment increased 975 to 41,265; (2.4%), Graduate enrollment increased (up 320 to 9,807; 3.4%) while graduate professional enrollment increased (up 135 to 2,953; 4.8%). Overall, three sources of undergraduate enrollment decreased; new first-quarter freshmen down 53 to 440; (-10.8%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 down 6 to 507; (-1.2%) and transfer students above Rank 2 decreased 4.5% (down 26 to 557). The remaining two sources; continuing students (up 954 to 38,282; 2.6%) and returning students (up 106 to 1,479; 7.7%) increased enough to offset the decreases and return an overall increase. At the extended campuses as a whole, four undergraduate source categories recorded an increase. Enrollment of new first quarter freshmen (up 24 to 215, 12.6%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 13 to 84; 18.3%), continuing students (up 277 to 5,620; 5.2%) and returning students (up 105 to 403; 35.2%). The remaining category, transfer students above Rank 2, experienced a decrease (down 14 to 162; -8.0%). Three of the sources of undergraduate enrollment at the Columbus campus decreased: new first-quarter freshmen (down 77 to 225, -25.5%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (down 19 to 423, -4.3%) and transfer students above Rank 2 (down 12 to 395; -2.9%). Continuing students increased 677 to 32,662; (2.1%) and returning students was up by 1 to 1,076; (0.1%). The enrollment of graduate students at the Columbus campus for Winter 2002 was higher than Winter 2001, with an increase of 399 to 9,414 (4.4%). The enrollment of graduate students at all extended campuses was down 79 to 393; (-16.7%). Overall enrollment of new graduate students was down 62 to 381 (-14.0%). Enrollment of both continuing graduate students (up 135 to 8,569; 1.6%) and returning graduate students (up 247 to 857; 40.5%) was up. As a result, enrollment of graduate students was up 320 to 9,807 (3.4%) overall. Enrollment of graduate professional students was up 135 to 2,953 (4.8%). [Table 2].

- Twelve undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw an increase in enrollment from Winter 2001 in excess of ten percent. They were Arts and Sciences, Unknown (up 420 to 536; 362.1%), Biological Sciences (up 462 to 2,003; 30%), Humanities (up 283 to 2,413; 13.3%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (up 600 to 1,241; 93.6%), Social and Behavioral Sciences (up 1,449 to 5,711; 34%), Dental Hygiene (up 30 to 117; 34.5%), Engineering (up 497 to 4,403; 12.7%), Architecture (up 141 to 603; 30.5%), Human Ecology (up 682 to 2,147; 46.6%), Business (up 1,293 to 3,570; 56.8%), Natural Resources (up 162 to 400; 68.1%), Allied Medical Professions (up 256 to 686; 59.5%). Four undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw a decrease in enrollment Winter 2001. They were Arts and Sciences, General (down 1,041 to 320; 76.5%), The Arts (down 192 to 1,295; 12.9%), Journalism (down 81 to 215; 27.4%), Undergraduate Student Academic Services (down 4579 to 5463; 45.6%). These enrollment shifts for undergraduate curricular programs can be attributed to the changes within the College of Arts and Sciences and the trend toward direct enrollment at The Ohio State University. Graduate level programs recording changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent with the indicated number and percent change were: Journalism (up 8 to 46; 21.1%), Allied Medical Professions (up 67 to 110, 155.8%), Social Work (up 36 to 370; 10.8%), the graduate program in Optometry (up 2 to 14; 16.7%), and the graduate program in Veterinary Medicine (up 45 to 119; 60.8%). The graduate professional program in Pharmacy recorded an increase of 45.9%, an increase of 96 to 305. [Table 3]
- Credits generated by full-time undergraduates increased at Columbus (up 14,654 to 474,877; 3.2%) and for the extended campuses as a whole (up 7,805 to 74,747; 11.7%). The result was overall increase of 22,459 to 549,624 (4.3%) from Winter Quarter 2001. Credits for part-time students decreased in total; down 1,449 to 46,667 (-3.0%). Credits generated by part-time undergraduates at Columbus decreased 3.1% (down 1,135 to 34,976) while the extended campuses decreased 2.6% (down 314 to 11,691). The total credits generated by undergraduates for the entire university increased 21,010 to 596,291 (3.7%). As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level for the university increased, credit per student increased slightly (up 0.17 to 14.45, 1.2%) compared to Winter 2001. At the graduate level, there was an overall increase in credits (up 6,374 to 107,675; 6.3%). The Columbus campus increased 6,995 to 103,763; (7.2%) and the extended campuses as a whole decreased 621 to 3,912; (-13.7%). Graduate credits per student for the university as a whole were up 2.8 percent with 10.98 credits per student. Graduate professional credits per student were down by 6.5 percent as total credits decreased 1,102 credits to 52,868. Undergraduate FTE increased from 38,352 to 39,753. Graduate professional FTE decreased from 3,598 to 3,524. Graduate FTE increased from 6,753 to 7,178. [Table 4]
- For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from last winter; Highland (up 26.6%), Meigs (up 28.6%), Noble (up 23.5%) and Vinton (up 22.2%). For the Columbus campus, the counties which recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent were Clinton (up 25.6%), Highland (up 23.8%), Jackson (down 21.4%) Meigs (up 21.4%) and Vinton (up 66.7%). [Table 5 and Table 6]
- For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Winter were: Massachusetts (up 23.8%), Utah (up 29.0%), Arizona (up 27.8%), Oregon (up 25.0%), Oklahoma (up 24.0%), District of Columbia (up 42.9%), Idaho (up 35.3%), Mississippi (up 63.6%), Vermont (up 62.5%), Montana (up 100.0%), South Dakota (down 40.0%) and Wyoming (down 25.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Winter were: Massachusetts (up 25.0%), Utah (up 29.3%), Arizona (up 27.8%), Oregon (up 25.0%), Oklahoma (up 24.0%), District of Columbia (up 42.9%), Idaho (up 35.3), Mississippi (up 54.5%), Montana (up 100.0%), Vermont (up 50.0%), South Dakota (down 40.0%) and Wyoming (down 25.0%) [Table 7 and Table 8]

## Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, Malaysia (up 27.3%), Pakistan (up 27.6%), Spain (up 26.1%) and Nigeria (up 38.9%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Winter Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Taiwan, Japan, Turkey and Canada recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]
- Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 10.0% decreasing from 14.3% last Winter. Undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Business (8.5%) and Engineering (8.0%). International student enrollment was 4,130 for the total university and 4,119 on the Columbus campus. Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (42.0%), Journalism (47.8%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (49.1%), Engineering (70.7%), Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (45.0%), and Pharmacy (52.3%) were international students. Total University enrollment of 30 International Graduate Professional and 2,602 Graduate students were record highs for Winter Quarter. [Table 10]
- Winter Quarter record high enrollments among African Americans (3,547 at Columbus, 3,732 total) American Indians or Alaskan Natives (199 at Columbus, 230 total) Asian or Pacific Islanders (2,419 at Columbus, 2,505) total and Hispanics (904 at Columbus, 950 total) were reached this quarter. [Tables 11, 12, and 13]
- At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 718 to 36,803; 2.0%) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents increased (up 257 to 4,462; 6.1%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 113 to 5,713; 2.0%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 207 to 4,094; 5.3%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents increased 109 to 2,722 (up 4.2%) and not-Ohio residents increased 26 to 231 (up 12.7%). [Table 14]
- Record high enrollment of 1,512 female Graduate Professional students was reached this Winter Quarter. [Table 15]
