Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Winter Quarter of 2004

January 26, 2004

Winter Quarter 2004 began on January 5, 2004. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on January 22nd. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

An overall increase in enrollment of 1,043 students compared to Winter Quarter 2003 was recorded for this quarter for a total of 56,231. All but two campuses experienced increases in enrollment; Columbus (up 827 to 49,083; 1.7%), Mansfield (up 180 to 1,571; 12.9%) Marion (up 62 to 1,489; 4.3%) and Newark (up 46 to 2,045; 2.3%). Lima decreased by 4 to 1,287; (-0.3) and Wooster was down 68 to 756; (-8.3%) . [Table 1]

Increases in Undergraduate and Graduate Professional enrollment contributed to the increase in total enrollment while Graduate enrollment decreased slightly. Undergraduate enrollment increased 987 to 43,216; (2.3%), while graduate professional enrollment increased by 149 to a record high of 3,196 (4.9%). Graduate enrollment decreased by 93 to 9,819 (-0.9%) Overall, all but one source of undergraduate enrollment increased; new first-quarter freshmen up 41 to 357; (13.0%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 up 41 to 513; (8.7%), transfer students above Rank 2 increased 19.4% (up 90 to 554) and continuing students (up 834 to 40,545; 2.1%). The decrease in returning students (down 19 to 1,247; -1.5%) was not enough to affect the overall increase. At the extended campuses as a whole, all but one undergraduate source category recorded increases. Enrollment of new first quarter freshmen (up 42 to 201, 26.4%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 20 to 107; 23.0%), transfer students above Rank 2, (up 6 to 150; 4.2%) and continuing students (up 181 to 6,027; 3.1%). The remaining category, returning students, was down 12 to 332; -3.5%. Three of the sources of undergraduate enrollment at the Columbus campus increased: transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 21 to 406, 5.5%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 84 to 404; 26.3%) and Continuing students increased 653 to 34,518; (1.9%). The two remaining sources decreased; new first-quarter freshmen (down 1 to 156, -0.6%) and returning students (down 7 to 915, -0.8%). The enrollment of graduate students at the Columbus campus for Winter 2004 was lower than Winter 2003, with a decrease of 72 to 9,488 (-0.8%). The enrollment of graduate students at all extended campuses was down 21 to 331; (-6.0%). Overall enrollment of new graduate students was up 37 to 381 (10.7%). The increase in enrollment of continuing graduate students (up 117 to 8,914; 1.3%) was not large enough to offset the decrease in the returning students (down 247 to 524 (-32.0%). As a result, enrollment of graduate students as a whole was down 93 to 9,819 (-0.9%). Enrollment of graduate professional students was up 149 to 3,196 (4.9%). [Table 2].

Six undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw an increase in enrollment from Winter 2003 in excess of ten percent. They were Arts and Sciences, General (up 254 to 800; 46.5%), Education (up 108 to 697; 18.3%), Allied Medical Professions (up 120 to 897; 15.4%), Nursing (up 162 to 779; 26.3%), Pharmacy (up 85 to 244; 53.5%) and Social Work (up 49 to 179; 37.7%). One undergraduate curricular academic program at Columbus, Arts and Sciences, Unknown (down 128 to 75; -63.1%), saw a decrease in excess of ten percent in enrollment from Winter 2003. Graduate level programs recording changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent with the indicated number and percent change were: Journalism (down 10 to 33; -23.3%), Human Ecology (down 17 to 98, -14.8%); Social Work (up 39 to 422; 10.2%) and the graduate program in Optometry (up 2 to 14; 16.7%). The graduate professional program in Pharmacy recorded an increase of 17.7%, an increase of 72 to 479. [Table 3]

Credits generated by full-time undergraduates increased at Columbus (up 19,928 to 517,860; 4.0%) and for the extended campuses as a whole (up 4,137 to 81,000; 5.4%). The result was an overall increase of 24,065 to 598,860 (4.2%) from Winter Quarter 2003. Credits for part-time students decreased in total; down 2,005 to 41,406 (-4.6%). Credits generated by part-time undergraduates at Columbus decreased 6.5% (down 2,090 to 29,851) while the extended campuses increased 0.7% (up 85 to 11,555). The total credits generated by undergraduates for the entire university increased 22,060 to 640,266 (3.6%). As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level for the university increased, credit per student increased slightly (up 0.18 to 14.82, 1.2%) compared to Winter 2003. At the graduate level, there was an overall increase in credits (up 3,188 to 113,901; 2.9%). The Columbus campus increased 3,278 to 110,899; (3.0%) and the extended campuses as a whole decreased 90 to 3,002; (-2.9%). Graduate credits per student for the university as a whole were up 3.9 percent with 11.60 credits per student. Graduate professional credits per student were up by 0.7 percent as total credits increased 3,118 credits to 58,850. Undergraduate FTE increased from 41,214 to 42,684. Graduate professional FTE increased from 3,716 to 3,923. Graduate FTE increased from 7,381 to 7,593. [Table 4]

For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from last winter; Adams (down 29.0%), Meigs (up 76.5%), Paulding (up 25.5%) and Preble (up 22.6%). For the Columbus campus, the counties which recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent were Adams (down 30.0%), Holmes (down 20.6%), Meigs (up 75.0%), Noble (up 35.3%), Preble (up 23.4%), and Van Wert (up 22.2%). For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Winter were: Texas (up 24.3%), Iowa (up 48.6%), Alabama (down 20.9%), District of Columbia (up 21.4%), New Hampshire (down 23.3%), Rhode Island (up 21.1%) and South Dakota (down 50.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Winter were: Texas (up 23.2%), Iowa (up 56.3%), District of Columbia (up 21.4%), Rhode Island (up 21.1%), New Hampshire (down 26.7%) and South Dakota (down 50.0%). Highlights

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Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, Canada (up 22.0%), Mexico (up 29.2%), Russia (down 21.6%), France (down 23.3%) and Nigeria (down 26.1%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Winter Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Taiwan, Japan, Canada and Turkey recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]

Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 11.4%, down from 12.5% last Winter. Other undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Business (8.9%) and Engineering (8.1%). International student enrollment was 4,070 for the total university and 4,059 on the Columbus campus. Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (47.4%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (50.5%), Engineering (62.4%), Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (44.0%), and Pharmacy (59.1%) were international students. The graduate program in Veterinary Medicine international enrollment of 44.8%. Total University enrollment of 44 International Graduate Professional students was a record high for Winter Quarter. [Table 10]

Winter Quarter record high enrollments among Asian or Pacific Islanders (2,614 at Columbus, 2,720 total) and Hispanics (1,038 at Columbus, 1,115 total) were reached this quarter. [Tables 11, 12, and 13]

At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 1,025 to 38,627; 2.7%) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents decreased (down 38 to 4,589; -0.8%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 220 to 5,544; -3.8%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 127 to 4,275; 3.1%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents increased 87 to 2,891 (up 3.1%) and not-Ohio residents increased 62 to 305 (up 25.5%). [Table 14]

Record high enrollment of 21,189 female undergraduate, 1,708 female Graduate Professional and 28,238 total female students was reached this Winter Quarter. [Table 15]
