Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Winter Quarter of 2006

January 24, 2006

Winter Quarter 2006 began on January 3, 2006. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on January 20th. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall increase in enrollment of 262 students compared to Winter Quarter 2005 was reported this quarter for a total of 55,963. Four campuses experienced increases in enrollment: Columbus (up 257 to 49,084; 0.5%), Marion (up 49 to 1,496; 3.4%), Newark (up 25 to 2,040; 1.2%) and Wooster (up 44 to 747; 6.3%) while the remaining two campuses experienced a decrease: Lima (down 60 to 1,113; -5.1%), and Mansfield (down 53 to 1,483; -3.5%). [Table 1]
  
- Undergraduate student enrollment experienced an increase compared to Winter Quarter 2005; Graduate and Graduate Professional enrollment decreased as a whole. Undergraduate enrollment increased (up 305 to 42,769; 0.7%), while Graduate Professional enrollment decreased by 19 to 3,252 (-0.6%) and Graduate enrollment decreased by 24 to 9,942 (-0.2%). As a whole, all sources of undergraduate enrollment increased; new first-quarter freshmen (up 9 to 273; 3.4%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 100 to 563; 21.6%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 94 to 562; 20.1%), continuing students (up 95 to 40,246; 0.2%) and returning students (up 7 to 1,125; 0.6%). At the extended campuses all but one of the undergraduate source categories recorded increases. The undergraduate source category that experienced a decrease was continuing students (down 124 to 5,756; -2.1%). The remaining source categories at the extended campuses experienced increases in enrollment: new first quarter freshmen (up 24 to 189, 14.5%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 9 to 93; 10.7%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 37 to 156; 31.1%), and returning students (up 16 to 298; 5.7%). Three sources of undergraduate enrollment at the Columbus campus increased: transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 91 to 470, 24.0%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 57 to 406; 16.3%), and continuing students (up 219 to 34,490; 0.6%). The remaining two undergraduate source categories experienced a decrease: new first-quarter freshmen (down 15 to 84; -15.2%), and returning students (down 9 to 827, -1.1%). Graduate student enrollment at the Columbus campus for Winter 2006 was fewer than Winter 2005; a decrease of 67 to 9,555 (-0.7%) was reported. Enrollment of graduate students at all extended campuses was up 43 to 387; (12.5%). Overall, enrollment of new graduate students was up 50 to 402 (14.2%). Enrollment of continuing graduate students decreased (down 123 to 9,004; -1.3%) while returning students increased (up 49 to 536; 10.1%). As a result, enrollment of graduate students as a whole was down 24 to 9,942 (-0.2%). Enrollment of graduate professional students was down 19 to 3,252 (-0.6%). [Table 2].

- Five undergraduate curricular academic programs at the Columbus campus saw an increase in enrollment from Winter 2005 in an excess of ten percent; these programs include Arts and Sciences, General (up 134 to 914; 17.2%), Music (up 50 to 338; 17.4%), Dental Hygiene (up 20 to 158; 14.5%), Allied Medical Professions (up 235 to 1,332; 21.4%), and Pharmacy (up 75 to 416; 22.0%). Two undergraduate curricular academic programs at the Columbus campus decreased in an excess of ten percent in enrollment from Winter 2005; these were Arts and Sciences, Unknown (down 25 to 45; -35.7%) and Journalism (down 20 to 149; -11.8%). Graduate level programs reporting changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent were: Arts and Sciences, General (down 1 to 0; -100.0%), Journalism (down 32 to 0; -100.0%), Architecture (up 19 to 187; 11.3%), Allied Medical Professions (up 27 to 208, 14.9%), Pharmacy (down 11 to 85; -11.5%) and the graduate program in Medicine (up 36 to 372; 10.7%). [Table 3]
- Credits generated by full-time undergraduates increased at the Columbus campus (up 9,390 to 526,037; 1.8%) and at the extended campuses (up 731 to 78,806; 0.9%). The result was an overall increase of 10,121 to 604,843 (1.7%) from Winter Quarter 2005. Credits for part-time students decreased in total (down 2,013 to 36,814, -5.2%) with credits generated by part-time undergraduates at Columbus decreasing 4.9% (down 1,380 to 26,638) and at the extended campuses (down 633 to 10,176; -5.9%). Total credits generated by undergraduates for the entire university increased 8,108 to 641,657 (1.3%). With the total credit hours at the undergraduate level for the university increasing, credits per student increased as well (up 0.08 to 15.00, 0.6%) compared to Winter 2005. At the graduate level, there was an overall decrease in credits (down 447 to 114,639; -0.4%): at the Columbus campus a decrease in credits was reported (down 648 to 111,193; -0.6%) while the extended campuses as a whole reported an increase (up 201 to 3,446; 6.2%). Graduate credits per student for the entire university were down 0.1 percent with 11.53 credits per student. Graduate professional credits per student were down by 0.4 percent while total credits also decreased (down 554 credits to 58,982). Undergraduate full time equivalents (FTE) increased from 42,237 to 42,777. Graduate professional FTE decreased from 3,969 to 3932. Graduate FTE decreased from 7,672 to 7,643. [Table 4]
- For the total university, the following counties reported enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from last winter; Brown (up 28.6%), Harrison (up 55.6%), Morgan (down 30.3%), Noble (down 20.8%), Pike (up 31.8%) and Vinton (up 53.8%). For the Columbus campus, the counties which recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent were Harrison (up 25.0%), Morgan (down 26.9%), Noble (down 23.8%), Pike (up 32.6%) and Vinton (up 50.0%). - For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Winter were: Georgia (up 25.4%), South Carolina (down 26.7%), Puerto Rico (down 26.1%), New Hampshire (up 25.0%), Alaska (up 43.8%), Nevada (up 30.8%), Montana (down 26.7%), Wyoming (up 28.6%) and the Virgin Islands (up 50.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Winter were: Georgia (up 25.4%), South Carolina (down 25.4%), Alabama (up 21.2%), Puerto Rico (down 26.1%), New Hampshire (up 30.4%), Alaska (up 37.5%), Arkansas (down 21.7%), Nevada (up 30.8%), Montana (down 26.7%), Wyoming (up 28.6%) and the Virgin Islands (up 50.0%). ## Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, Indonesia (down 22.6%), Romania (down 23.7%), Mexico (down 22.6%), Pakistan (down 26.9%), Saudi Arabia (up 125.0%), United Arab Emirates (up 21.4%), and Russia (down 40.7%), reported changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Winter Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Taiwan, Indonesia, Japan, and Turkey recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]
- Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 9.4%; this is down from 11.4% last Winter. Other undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent include Business (7.4%) and Engineering (6.6%). International student enrollment was recorded at 3,628 for the total university and 3,614 on the Columbus campus. There are several graduate programs in which forty percent or more of students enrolled were international students; these programs included: Biological Sciences (47.7%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (48.5%), Engineering (60.7%), Food, Agriculture, and Environmental Sciences (44.7%) and Pharmacy (64.7%). The graduate program in Veterinary Medicine recorded an international enrollment of 42.6%. [Table 10]
- A Winter Quarter record high of enrollment among Hispanic students (1,137 at Columbus, 1,214 total) was reached this quarter. [Tables 11, 12, and 13]
- At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 483 to 38,582; 1.3%) while enrollment of non-Ohio residents decreased (down 178 to 4,187; -4.1%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 131 to 5,781; 2.3%) while non-Ohio residents decreased (down 155 to 4,161; -3.6%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents (down 7 to 2,949, -0.2%) and non-Ohio residents (down 12 to 303; -3.8%) decreased this quarter. [Table 14]
