Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Winter Quarter of 2009

January 26, 2009

Winter Quarter began on January 5, 2009. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on January 19. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- There was an overall increase in enrollment for Winter Quarter 2009 compared to Winter Quarter 2008 (up 620 to 59,144; 1.1%). Three campuses had increases in enrollment: Columbus (up 595 to 51,724; 1.2%), Lima (up 38 to 1,332; 2.9%), and Marion (up 95 to 1,607; 6.3%). Three campuses had decreases in enrollment: Mansfield (down 42 to 1,491; -2.7%), Newark (down 62 to 2,314; -2.6%), and Wooster (down 4 to 676; -0.6%). [Table 1]
- Undergraduate enrollment increased this quarter (up 688 to 45,823; 1.5%), but there were decreases in graduate professional enrollment (down 5 to 3,225; -0.2%) and graduate enrollment (down 63 to 10,096; -0.6%).

Three of five source categories of total undergraduate enrollment increased: new first-quarter freshman (up 38 to 262; 17.0%), transfer students above rank 2 (up 88 to 666; 15.2%), and continuing students (up 838 to 43,401; 2.0%). The two remaining source categories decreased: transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 45 to 499; -8.3%), and former students (down 231 to 995; -18.8%).

At the Columbus campus, three undergraduate source categories increased: new first-quarter freshman (up 36 to 94; 62.1%), transfer students above rank 2 (up 78 to 512; 18.0%), and continuing students (up 704 to 36,922; 1.9%). The remaining two source categories decreased: transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 7 to 427; -1.6%), and former students (down 161 to 740; -17.9%).

At the extended campuses as a whole, three undergraduate source categories increased: new first-quarter freshman (up 2 to 168; 1.2%), transfer students above rank 2 (up 10 to 154; 6.9%), and continuing students (up 134 to 6,479; 2.1%). The remaining two source categories decreased: transfer students in ranks 1 and 2 (down 38 to 72; -34.5%) and former students (down 70 to 255; -21.5%).

The enrollment of graduate students at the Columbus campus for Winter Quarter 2009 decreased from Winter Quarter 2008 (down 50 to 9,804; -0.5%) as did the enrollment of graduate students at the extended campuses (down 13 to 292; -4.3%). Total university enrollment increased for continuing graduate students (up 45 to 9,277; 0.5%), but decreased for new graduate students (down 9 to 402; -2.2%), and former graduate students (down 99 to 417; -19.2%). [Table 2]

- At the Columbus campus, two undergraduate curricular programs saw an increase in enrollment from Winter Quarter 2008 in excess of ten percent. They were: Arts and Sciences, Unknown (up 38 to 75; 102.7%), and Earth Sciences (up 7 to 69; 11.3%). Two undergraduate programs saw a decrease in excess of ten percent: Dental Hygiene (down 26 to 133; -16.4%), and Undergraduate Student Academic Services (down 125 to 169; -42.5%). Additionally, Continuing Education saw a decrease in excess of ten percent (down 196 to 740; -20.9%). At the graduate level, two programs recorded enrollment increases in excess of ten percent: Nursing (up 40 to 355; 12.7%), and Public Affairs (up 22 to 116; 23.4%). Five graduate programs saw decreases in excess of ten percent: Earth Sciences (down 7 to 42; -14.3%), Education and Human Ecology (down 166 to 1,342; -11.0%), Pharmacy (down 19 to 76; -20.0%), Public Health (down 29 to 259; -10.1%), and Optometry (down 3 to 11; -21.4%) . [Table 3]
- For the total university, credits generated by undergraduates increased (up 20,029 to 699,235; 2.9%) from Winter Quarter 2008. There was a net increase for Columbus undergraduate credits (up 17,986 to 599,864; 3.1%) with full-time credits up (20,813 to 575,569; 3.8%) and part-time credit down (2,827 to 24,295; -10.4%). At the extended campuses as a whole, there was a net increase of undergraduate credits (up 2,043 to 99,371; 2.1%), with full-time credits up (3,590 to 90,257; 4.1%) and part-time credits down (-1,547 to 9,114; -14.5%). As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level throughout the university increased, so did credits per student (up 0.21 to 15.26; 1.4%). At the graduate level for the total university, there was a net decrease in credits (down 14,234 to 104,438; -12.0%). Columbus graduate credits were down (-14,389 to 101,802; -12.4%), extended campus graduate credits were up (155 to 2,636; 6.2%). Graduate professional credits increased (up 121 to 58,212; 0.2%). Undergraduate FTE increased from 45,280 to 46,616. Graduate professional FTE increased from 3873 to 3881. Graduate FTE decreased from 7,911 to 6,963. [Table 4]
- For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Winter Quarter 2008: Ashtabula (down 21.3%), Carroll (up 27.6%), Gallia (down 22.5%), Harrison (up 28.6%), and Morgan (up 52.6%). At Columbus, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative): Carroll (up 29.2%), Gallia (down 23.9%), Harrison (up 36.4%), and Morgan (up 25.0%). [Tables 5 and 6]
- For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from Winter Quarter 2008 were Rhode Island (up 37.5%), Vermont (up 75.0%), Wyoming (up 30.0%), North Dakota (down -28.6%), and Virgin Islands (up 100.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Winter Quarter were: Rhode Island (up 37.5%), Vermont (up 66.7%), Wyoming (up 30.0%), North Dakota (down -28.6%), and Virgin Islands (up 100.0%). Highlights

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- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at The Ohio State University, five recorded changes in excess of twenty percent from Winter Quarter 2008. They were: People's Republic of China (up 23.2%), Japan (down -21.8%), United Arab Emirates (up 25.0%), Vietnam (up 46.7%), and France (-29.2%). People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Taiwan, and Canada recorded enrollment of 100 or more students in Winter Quarter 2009. [Table 9]
- On the Columbus campus, Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 10.0 percent. Undergraduate curricular programs with international student enrollments in excess of five percent were: Arts and Sciences, Unknown (6.7%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (6.0%), and Business (10.9%). Undergraduate international enrollment was 1,271 for the total university and 1,264 on the Columbus campus. On the Columbus campus, forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (46.7%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (44.8%), Engineering (57.2%), Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences (46.7%), and Pharmacy (55.3%) were international students. - At the undergraduate level, enrollment increased for both Ohio residents (up 393 to 41,055; 1.0%) and not-Ohio residents (up 295 to 4,768; 6.6%). At the Graduate level, enrollment decreased for Ohio residents (down 85 to 5,814; -1.4%) and increased for not-Ohio residents (up 22 to 4,282; 0.5%). At the Graduate Professional level, enrollment decreased for Ohio residents (down 20 to 2,901; -0.7%) and increased for not-Ohio residents (up 15 to 324; 4.9%). [Table 14]
- Winter 2009 saw a record high total enrollment of 59,144. This included a record high undergraduate enrollment (45,823), male undergraduate enrollment (23,972), and female undergraduate enrollment (21,851). Female enrollment for all academic levels reached a record high (29,142). Record highs were also recorded for Asian or Pacific Islander students (2,857), and Hispanic students (1,462).
