Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Autumn Quarter of 2001

October 15, 2001

Autumn Quarter began on September 19, 2001. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on October 3. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall increase in enrollment of 694 students compared to Autumn Quarter 2000 was recorded for this quarter. The Columbus campus increased by 525 to 48,477 (1.1%). The Lima campus increased 118 to 1,356 (9.5%), Mansfield decreased 88 to 1,495 (-5.6%), Marion was up 114 to 1,390 (8.9%), Newark was up 54 to 2,079 (2.7%), and Wooster was down 29 to 940 (-3.0%). [Table 1]
- Increases in graduate professional enrollment (up 155 to 2,976; 5.5%), graduate enrollment (up 39 to 9,947; 0.4%), and undergraduate enrollment (up 500 to 42,814; 1.2%) each contributed to the net enrollment increase. The graduate professional enrollment of 2,976 surpassed the previous record of 2,936 from Autumn 1983. All but one source of undergraduate enrollment experienced increases. These increases include new first-quarter freshmen (up 59 to 8,049; 0.7%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 54 to 1,389; 4.0%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 83 to 1,568; 5.6%), and continuing students (up 317 to 30,118; 1.1%). The one source which decreased is former students (down 13 to 1,690; -0.8%). At the extended campuses as a whole, two source categories recorded a decrease: new first-quarter freshmen (down 61 to 2,155; -2.8%) and transfer students above Rank 2 (down 14 to 465; -2.9%). The three remaining categories experienced increases: transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 9 to 168; 5.7%), continuing students (up 246 to 3,503; 7.6%), and former students (up 20 to 474; 4.4%). Four sources of undergraduate enrollment at the Columbus campus experienced increases from Autumn 2000: new first-quarter freshmen (up 120 to 5,894; 2.1%), transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 45 to 1,221; 3.8%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 97 to 1,103; 9.6%), and continuing students (up 71 to 26,615; 0.3%). Former students was the one undergraduate source category experiencing a decrease on the Columbus campus (down 33 to 1,216; -2.6%). The enrollment of graduate students at Columbus campus for Autumn 2001 increased from Autumn 2000, up 70 to 9,452 (0.7%). The enrollment of graduate students at the extended campuses is down 31 to 495 (-5.9%). Overall, enrollment of new graduate students is up 52 to 2,331 (2.3%) as is the enrollment of continuing graduate students (up 4 to 7,025; 0.1%). Returning graduate students decreased (down 17 to 591; -2.8%). In total, enrollment of graduate students is up 39 to 9,947 (0.4%). Enrollment of graduate professional students is up 155 to 2,976 (5.5%). [Table 2]

- Three undergraduate curricular academic programs saw a decrease in enrollment from Autumn 2000 in excess of ten percent. These include Journalism (down 45 to 239; -15.8%) and Pharmacy (down 41 to 166; -19.8%). With the implementation of direct enrollment, University Student Academic Services decreased by nearly half (down 5,012 to 6,160; -44.9%). The move to direct enrollment also resulted in sixteen curricular academic programs having an increase in enrollment from Autumn 2000 in excess of ten percent: Arts and Sciences, General (up 902 to 2,381; 61.0%), Arts and Sciences, Unknown (up 50 to 194; 34.7%), The Arts (up 174 to 1,619; 12.0%), Biological Sciences (up 376 to 1,904; 24.6%), Humanities (up 275 to 2,350; 13.3%), Social and Behavioral Sciences (up 704 to 4,899; 16.8%), Business (up 1,308 to 3,797; 52.6%), Dental Hygiene (up 29 to 117; 33.0%), Engineering (up 456 to 4,514; 11.2%), Architecture (up 149 to 616; 31.9%), Natural Resources (up 147 to 395; 59.3%), Human Ecology (up 621 to 1,981; 45.7%), and Allied Medical Professions (up 213 to 740; 40.4%). Graduate level programs recording changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent with the indicated number and percent change are the graduate program in Journalism (up 8 to 49; 19.5%), Business (up 87 to 706; 14.1%), Education (down 366 to 1,906; -16.1%), Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences (up 34 to 360; 10.4%), Allied Medical Professions (up 57 to 111; 105.6%), Other Graduate Interdisciplinary (up 136 to 620; 28.1%), the graduate program in Optometry (up 3 to 14; 27.3%) and the graduate program in Veterinary Medicine (up 21 to 123; 20.6%). The graduate professional program in Pharmacy recorded an increase of 53.8%, an increase of 105 to 300. [Table 3]
- Credits generated by full-time undergraduates increased at both Columbus (up 8,866 to 489,364; 1.8%) and the extended campuses as a whole (up 2,898 to 78,183; 3.8%). The result was a total increase of 11,764 to 567,547 (2.1%) from Autumn Quarter 2000. Credits generated by part-time undergraduates at Columbus decreased 1.0% (down 329 to 34,260) while the extended campuses increased 33 to 11,516; (0.3%). The net result was an increase of 11,468 to 613,323 (1.9%) in credits generated by undergraduates for the entire university. As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level throughout the university increased, so did credit per student (up 0.10 to 14.33; 0.7%) compared to Autumn 2000. At the graduate level, there was an overall increase in credits (up 5,675 to 109,749; 5.5%). Columbus campus was up 5,610 to 105,029 (5.6%) and at the extended campuses as a whole there was an increase of 65 to 4,720 (1.4%). Overall graduate credits per student are up 9.3 percent, resulting from an increase in headcount (up 155 to 2,976; 5.5%) and an increase in credits (up 7,855 to 59,190; 15.3%). Undergraduate FTE increased from 40,124 to 40,888. Graduate professional FTE increased from 3,422 to 3,946. Graduate FTE increased from 6,938 to 7,317. [Table 4]
- For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from last Autumn are: Carroll (down 20.4%), Highland (up 24.2%) and Morgan (up 21.7%). At Columbus, the counties that recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent are: Carroll (down 25.0%), Clinton (up 22.1%), Highland (up 21.2%), and Monroe (down 29.2%). [Table 5 and Table 6]
- For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent from last Autumn are: Massachusetts (up 20.8%), Utah (up 33.7%), Arizona (up 26.3%), Oregon (up 20.5%), Puerto Rico (down 26.4%), Oklahoma (up 33.3%), District Of Columbia (up 44.4%), Idaho (up 47.1%), Mississippi (up 46.7%), North Dakota (up 27.3%), Vermont (up 33.3%), Montana (up 200.0%), Wyoming (up 50.0%), South Dakota (down 40.0%) and Guam (up 50.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Autumn are: Massachusetts (up 21.0%), Utah (up 32.6%), Arizona (up 26.3%), Oregon (up 20.5%), Iowa (down 22.0%), Puerto Rico (down 26.4%), Oklahoma (up 33.3%), District Of Columbia (up 38.9%), Idaho (up 47.1%), Mississippi (up 40.0%), Rhode Island (up 21.4%), North Dakota (up 40.0%), Montana (up 200.0%), Vermont (up 22.2%), South Dakota (down 40.0%), Wyoming (up 50.0%), and Guam (up 50.0%). - Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, Spain (up 33.3%), Nigeria (up 31.3%), and Columbia (up 54.5%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Autumn Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Taiwan, Japan, Turkey, and Canada recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]
- Continuing Education has an international enrollment of 12.2 percent. Undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent are Business (8.6%) and Engineering (7.7%). Undergraduate international enrollment is 1,546 for the total university and 1,537 on the Columbus campus. Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (43.8%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (49.6%), Journalism (49.0%), Engineering (70.1%), Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences (45.0%) Pharmacy (52.6%), and the graduate program in Veterinary Medicine (45.5%) are international students. A record high enrollment of 30 professional international students and 2,737 graduate international students was reached this quarter. [Table 10]
- Autumn Quarter had a record high enrollment among African American students (3,591 at Columbus, 3,780 total), American Indian/Alaskan Native (199 at Columbus, 225 total) and Hispanic students (924 at Columbus, 969 total). [Tables 11, 12, and 13]
- At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 261 to 38,230; 0.7%) and enrollment of not-Ohio residents increased (up 239 to 4,584; 5.5%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 182 to 5,637; -3.1%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 221 to 4,310; 5.4%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents increased 128 to 2,733 (up 4.9%) and not-Ohio residents increased 27 to 243 (up 12.5%). [Table 14]
- Autumn quarter had a record high 1,528 female professional students. [Table 16]
